

Workshop on "Carrier Guidance for the Differently Abled"

DATE: 21-08-2019

August 21st. 2019, the Equal On Opportunity cell and Centre for Differently Abled Persons, along with the Youth for Jobs Foundation, hosted a Career Guidance session for students who have a variety of disabilities. The program was developed to provide assistance to children with disabilities in their determining strengths and shortcomings, as well as in investigating



various ways for overcoming their flaws and transforming them into strengths. A questionnaire that evaluated employability abilities was given to each student, and the strengths of each individual student were distinguished. A total of forty-five students who had cognitive challenges, hearing impairments, and vision impairments benefited from the career assistance program. Ms. Nagasundari and Mr. Murugan, both of whom are involved with the Youth for Jobs foundation based in Hyderabad, were the individuals who functioned as resource persons.










One day workshop on "You can win-Employability training for Students with Hearing Impairment"


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Equal Opportunity Cell Bharathidasan University Report of the Activity of Observance of a World Braille day


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One week workshop on "Photoshop and 2D Animation and Employability skill"

DATE: 14-02-2020 to 21-02-2020

From 14 February to 21 February 2020, a one-week workshop on Photoshop and 2Danimation,



as well as employability skills was held in the Centre for Differently Abled Persons. Students with disabilities possess creative abilities that, with appropriate training and practise, can be enhanced and developed into an employability skill. As part of the initiative, students with disabilities received one-week of Photoshop and 2D animation training. Ms.Hemalatha and Dr. Kannan acted as resource persons, instructing students on how to create 2D animations using Flash and how to use Photoshop.

Additionally, students interacted with corporate organizations to gain an understanding of the sizable market for Photoshop and 2D animation. Dr Prasanna, Director, BECH, Bharathidasan University, and Dr Senthilnathan, Director, UGC HRDC, delivered the valedictory addresses and distributed certificates to the students. Students demonstrated their acquired knowledge in front of the audience.








One day industrial visit on "Ability Management for the Differently abled' **DATE 28-02-2020**

A one-day industrial visit focused on ability management was organised to familiarise students with job market expectations. Mr Shiva Jayagopal, Director of the academy in Bangalore, provided an overview of industry expectations and also took the students on a virtual tour of industries that employ people with disabilities. Interactions with disabled workers were held, and students interacted with them and clarified their doubts. The virtual industrial visit involved 48 students with disabilities and ten faculty members.
