SMART Journal of Business Management Studies, Department of Commerce and Financial Studies, Bharathidasan University and Department of General Business and Finance, Sam Houston State University, USA, in association with IQAC, Bharathidasan University jointly organized the Second International Workshop on “**Effective Teaching of Finance**” for the University and College Teachers during 27th and 28th July 2013 at the A/C Auditorium, Bharathidasan University.



Prof.V.Gopal, Professor of Finance and Accounting, Dean of Academics, Indian Institute of Management, Trichy, released the workshop CD containing the presentation of resource persons, while **Dr.S.Balakrishnan**, Professor, College of Applied Science, Nizwa, Oman, received the CD. More than 200 University and College Teachers participated in the workshop from across the country.

Dr. M.Selvam, Head, Department of Commerce and Financial Studies welcomed the gathering. In his Welcome Address, he pointed out that skill sets required for teaching should be enhanced, especially in the area of finance where the scope for ICT applications is ample.

Dr.S.Balakrishnan, Professor, College of Applied Science, Nizwa, Oman, delivered the Presidential Address. He advised the teachers to follow the interactive mode of teaching and

Learner Centric Approach to attract students and make teaching effective. He mentioned that finance is a challenging subject for teachers now a days. Teachers should possess not only communication skill but also soft skills, technical skills and computing skills. By encouraging the students, their participation in classes will be increased. Finally, he informed that technology plays an important role in the teaching process but technology cannot replace a teacher.

Prof.V.Gopal, Professor of Finance and Accounting, Dean of Academics, Indian Institute of Management, Trichy, delivered the Inaugural Address. He trained the participants to link the concepts to the current business situations and to bring about interface between reality and teaching. He explained that the success of teaching lies in the bridging between mind of the student and mouth of the teacher.

Dr.V.P.Sriraman from Bharathidasan Institute of Management, Tiruchirappalli, handled the sessions on topics like Equity Valuation and Financial Statement. He also explained the various techniques used in finance, practical applications of financial techniques and problems in financial analysis.

Dr.Balasundram Maniam, Professor, Sam Houston State University, USA, trained the participants on areas like How to Maintain Good Teaching Practices in Finance? and From Financial Calculator to Learning Management Systems. He confessed that though technology-integrated classrooms are costly to implement, it helps the students to solve complex tasks and use a variety of resources. He encouraged the teachers to update the modern technological teaching methods by attending workshops.

Dr. R.Subramaniam, Associate Professor, Bharathidasan Institute of Management, Trichy, discussed effective teaching methods in the area of Activity Based Costing and Target Costing. He explained the concepts, principles and their application in the area of business entity.

Dr.A.M. Mohamed Sindhasha, Principal, Jamal Mohamed College, delivered Valedictory Address. He mentioned in his address that if the teachers follow and apply the concepts presented in this workshop, they could earn good name among the students.



The major agenda of the present meeting were (i) Report of the activities of IQAC during the period January-April 2015, (ii) Informations about the constitution of Academic and Administrative Audit (AAA) Committee and (iii) Suggestions from the members for a better functioning of IQAC.

The meeting was headed by our honourable Vice-Chancellor. Professor Rajasekar, Director i/c of IQAC, welcome the members of IQAC. Our Vice-Chancellor highlighted the role of IQAC in enhancing the quality of academic and research programmes in an institution. Our Vice-Chancellor asked the members to give critical suggestions for a better functioning of IQAC. Then Professor Rajasekar briefly presented the past four months activities of IQAC. The major activities include the following.

1. Collection of students' feedback on teachers for all the courses of various programmes in the odd semester of the academic year 2014-15.
2. Request made to all the departments to get the feedbacks from students on the teachers, the courses and the programmes for the even semester of the year 2014-15.
3. Request made to all the Departments/Centers/Cells/Offices to fillup the Annual Quality Assurance Report for the academic periods 2012-13, 2013-14 and 2014-15.
4. Preparation of Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) Proforma as per the guidelines of UGC with effect from June 2013 and Scoring Sheet for CAS promotion and direct appointments of faculty.

A brief discussion on the UGC revised guidelines on PBAS was took place. Next, Professor Rajasekar mentioned the progress in undergoing fourth AAA. In this connection under the direction of our Vice-Chancellor oral acceptance from Prof.S.P. Thyagarajan (Sri Ramachandra Univ.), Prof.P. Kaliraj (Alagappa College of Technology, Anna Univ.), Prof.K. Pitchumani (Madurai Kamaraj Univ.), Prof.A. Balasubramanian (University of Mysore), Prof.S. Rajendran (Gandhigram Rural Institute) and Prof. M.A. Sudir (Central University of Kerala) has been obtained to serve as the members of the AAA Committee.

With reference to the above activities the members have made the following suggestions/resolutions.

1. It is resolved to obtain feedbacks from students through online from the academic year 2015-16.
2. The members have suggested to conduct the fourth Academic and Administrative Audit preferably in the month of August 2015.
3. It is resolved to make a request to our Human Resource Development Centre (Academic Staff College) to conduct a one-day Workshop on the Performance Based Appraisal System for Assistant Professor of our university.

4. The members suggested to strengthen the tie-ups with industries leading to patents and products -earn-money strategy.
5. Members have suggested to include the possibility of awarding points in the Academic Performance Indicators to the category of organization of conferences, seminars, refresher courses etc within the guidelines of UGC.

Appendix A

1. Should India focus its resources on universities, including liberal arts and social sciences so as to improve the country's position in the global rankings?

Yes. India should focus its resources on research universities, so as to improve the country's ranking in the world ranking to meet the following indicators:

- i) Papers published in Nature and Science
 - ii) Papers indexed in Science citation index expanded and social science citation index
 - iii) Per capita academic performance of an institution.
 - iv) Papers per faculty
 - v) Citations per paper
2. Should not India develop its own ranking system relying on indicators more suitable to Indian situation as other ranking systems have heavy weightage for perception/subjective factors in which Indian Universities lose out.

India should develop its own ranking system relying on indicators more suitable to Indian situation.

3. Accreditation has been made mandatory for all institutions? Is this approach correct or not?

This approach is incorrect. Accreditation may be made mandatory for publicly funded institutions.

4. How should we facilitate the process of accreditations to make the process more objectively verifiable and transparent?

All the data and supporting documents related to the accreditation should be made available in public domain for open access in such a way that any one can verify the scores awarded to an Institutions. That is even if millions of persons award the scores to an Institution the Institutions should get the same score.

5. Should we focus on programme accreditation or institutional accreditation or both?

Always both.

Appendix B

1. What changes could be suggested in the accreditation systems:
 - a) There should be three levels of quality assurance frame work need to be suggested to ensure the quality of the institution namely minimum requirement, stand requirement and advance requirement.
 - b) Unified HEQFW may water down the quality already acquired by the Institutions. Thus, to classify the institutions there should be three level frame work. A clear vision, mission and goals of individual departments should be insisted with a short term plan and long term plan of the institution.
 - c) Thus state HEC/State AC should receive them. The Institution keep them open in the public domains. The concept of placement and consultancy existing in the engineering or medicine related institutions cannot be so emphasize to the arts and science colleges / universities. These facts are based on the locality of the institutions.
 - d) Weighing an institution based on the placement and consultancy will be different for rural, semi-urban and urban.
2. What are the hindering factors that make our higher education institutions fare poorly in world rankings?
 - a) Total revamping of the current pattern, skills and knowledge testing need to be focus with proper combinations of creative intelligent and analytic minds of each student.
 - b) Minimize the gap between the teaching community and industry.
3. Suggest ways to help our universities to achieve global standards.
 - a) Real curricular academic reforms of CBCS.
 - b) Credit transfer demands a lot of insight on common syllabi-hours etc including freedom and flexibility of different courses.
 - c) Student-faculty mobility demands a lot of common platform or networking of various institutions in the closed domain.
 - d) Though basic science facilitates a deep knowledge, inter related disciplines potentials may provide deep sense of appreciation and interest to the students.
 - e) To promote research-innovation-Entrepreneurship, a proper incubation centre is a must in every institution which can nurture habit of going on syllabus.

Minutes of the IQAC Meeting Held on 02-11-2015 at 11.30 am

A meeting with the members of IQAC is held on 02-11-2015 at 11.30 am in the IQAC Room to discuss the implementations of the Recommendations given by the NAAC Peer Team in 2012 at the time of last Accreditation. The following resolutions have been made in this regard.

1) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

An IPR (Intellectual Property Right) Cell needs to be established.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

Prof. M. Krishnan, Syndicate Member, Department of Environmental Biotechnology is the present Coordinator of the IPR Cell. The Cell has to be strengthened with at least 5 members including 1-Coordinator, 1-Co-coordinator (Professor), 1-Industrialist, 1-Lawyer and 1-Medical Doctor. The Cell may conduct awareness and training programmes regularly. Information about the IPR Cell and its objectives have to be made available in our University website.

2) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

University should make efforts to get equivalence for its degrees which have different nomenclatures such as Animal Science, Plant Science, Educational Technology, with those commonly accepted nomenclatures like Zoology, Botany and so on.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

Department of Plant Science has got the equivalence for its Programme M.Sc. Plant Biotechnology as M.Sc. Botany (GO.(Ms.) No. 116 dt 22-07-2014 of Higher Education (K2) Department).

Department of Animal Science has applied for getting equivalence of its Programme – M.Sc. Animal Biotechnology as M.Sc. Zoology. The Department of Animal Science and Council for College and Curriculum Development (CCCD) can be asked to make a follow-up of the proposal submitted.

Remarks have to be obtained from the Head of the Department of Education Technology in connection with the obtaining an equivalence of the Programmes offered by the Department of Education Technology.

3) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

Technical courses such as M.Tech. and M.B.A. should be strengthened by following AICTE guidelines and engaging teachers with technical qualifications.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

- i) Request has to be made to the University to appoint a few qualified faculty as per the guidelines of AICTE.
- ii) Departments conducting the M.Tech and M.B.A Programmes have to be asked to strengthen the curriculum of the Programmes as per the guidelines of AICTE.
- iii) Outside experts may be invited to give popular special lectures.

4) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

Course work for Ph.D. needs to be made more rigorous.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

- i) Common entrance examination for admission to Ph.D. Programme.
- ii) Course work should be approved by the Department Research Committee in addition to the Doctoral Committee.
- iii) Regular classes should be conducted and proper attendance register should be maintained.
- iv) For each course 3 tests and seminar/assignment should be conducted for continuous internal assessment and the details of the marks awarded to the candidates should be informed to the Controller of Examinations.
- v) For the final comprehensive examination the question papers setting and the valuation of the answer sheets should be done by external examiners.

5) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

In-campus transport facilities for students may be provided.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

As an initiative a van/bus service (i) from the main administrative building to the main entrance via the various departments and (ii) from the main entrance to the main administrative building via the various departments may be provided every one hour on all working days during the time 10.00 am to 5.00 pm.

6) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

Language lab needs to be enlarged for improving communication skills of weaker students.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

The existing language lab in the Department of English may be extended to the students of other Departments also. If softwares are available for the preparation for the Toefl, GRE and other related examinations then they may be purchased and access to this facility may also be provided to the interested students.

7) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

For PG and research students, hostel accommodation along with facilities may be enhanced.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

The existing facilities in all the hostels including the Wi-Fi internet facility can be maintained with the fullest satisfaction of the students and research scholars and the basic facilities required by them may also be provided.

8) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

The counseling and placement cells should be made active with maintenance of database and follow-up. Mega placement fairs may be organized for exposure and employment.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

These recommendations can be implemented.

9) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

The university may create a good health centre with a full time doctor and other staff as large number of students are residing in hostels.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

This recommendation may be implemented by expanding the facilities in the Health Centre and it may be opened till 8.00 pm. A Health Centre may be setup at the Khajamalai Campus also.

10) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

Efforts should be made to enhance sports and cultural activities and events should be organized time to time.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

The Department of Physical Education can be asked to enhance the sports facilities in both the campuses of our university and take necessary steps to conduct more number of sports events every year.

The NSS unit can be asked to conduct more number of cultural activities every year.

11) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

CBCS should be reconfigured in consonance with the UGC guidelines.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

CBCS pattern followed in our University Departments has to be reconfigured along the guidelines of UGC as much as possible. IQAC may ask CCCD to take necessary action in this regard.

12) Recommendation by the NAAC Peer Team:

The University has not attracted students from other states.

Suggestions by the IQAC:

Department of Biomedical Science and IQAC Circadian Rhythm- The Biological Clock

We all know what sleep is and what is awake? Most of the people always tend to feel energized around same times every day or feel drowsy or sleepy around same times every day. Your brain made this routine by itself. Have you ever wonder why you are getting sleep or awake at particular time of a day or night? This is what called your sleep wake cycle or circadian rhythm. What is circadian rhythm? Circadian means “about a day” “circa” = about. In your brain, a part called hypothalamus regulate your circadian rhythm. Outside factors or environmental factors have impact on your rhythm. In your brain there is 24 hours biological internal clock which runs in your background and cycles between sleepiness and alertness at regular intervals. A one day seminar on “The Vision and Art of Kazuo Ishiguro” (Noble Laureate in Literature, 2017) was organized by Department of English and IQAC of Bharathidasan University on 28.4.18.

Faculty members, scholars and students from various departments of Bharathidasan University and affiliated Colleges of Bharathidasan University and other institutions outside Bharathidasan University participated. The number of participants was 105.

**REPORT ON BUDS THINK 2017: NOBEL PRIZE FOR ECONOMICS HELD ON
26TH APRIL 2018**

The Department of Commerce and Financial Studies, Bharathidasan University in association with Internal Quality Assurance Cell, Bharathidasan University organised **BUDS THINK 2017: NOBEL PRIZE FOR ECONOMICS**, on 26th April 2018. **Prof. Muthusamy**, Director, Research, Bharathidasan University inaugurated the event and delivered the inaugural address. He stated that after the knowing the psychology of the people, the economic policy should be framed. He raised his observations relating to the economic reforms on taxing system and suggested that for a bigger economy like India, we need regularized taxing system or a unified taxing system. He encouraged the students to develop the Business Model by quoting the example of Ola car, a Business model developed by an IITB Alumni.

Prof. S. Rajasekar, Director, IQAC in his felicitation note mentioned that learning is an endless process provides joy while learning. He stated that for each subject there is a 'nuance', if you are able to identify that, then through your life you will have a love on that specific subject, naturally.

Prof. Selvam, Senior Advisor, IQAC, Bharathidasan University delivered lecture on the topic "**Behvaioral Economic Orientations of Richard H. Thaler**". He mentioned that the subject Economic was included in the Nobel Prize in 1969, knowing the importance of economics in nation development. He explained the contributions of Richard Thaler, pioneer in Behavioural Economics, who applied psychological research in economic decision making. He stated that the Nudge theory promotes that instead of forcing a decision, prompt the people to decision; also prompting people towards socially is a good decisions.

Prof. S. Iyyampillai, Senior Professor (Retd), Department of Economics, Bharathidasan University delivered the lecture on the topic "**Relevance of Richard H. Thaler's Nudge Theory to India**". He described the explanation given by Richard for the statement "Don't think people are rational, they are irrational". Richard also explains that the statement "Before taking decision need to collect and analyse before buying" is also false. Behavioural 'nudge' is opposed to a hard economic incentive with monetary rewards and punishments. Through the power of suggestion one can steel people towards good outcome. 'Nudge' is the interventions which are simple to operational and cheaper than more formal economic incentives. **Prof.S. Iyyampillai** also detailed the criticism raised by various economists about Nudge Theory and also explained the context of Nudge Theory applied in Indian Economy.

The Department of Biochemistry, Bharathidasan University organized a special lecture in collaboration with Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) on portraying Nobel Prize winners under BUDS THINK 2018. This event was also jointly organized by Department of Chemistry; Bharathidasan University.

Dr. Ramanathan Natesh, Associate Professor was invited from School of Biology, Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, (IISER), Thriuvananthapuram. He delivered special lecture highlighting the topic led to grab the Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2017. He delivered his lecture on 25.04.2018 at 11.00 AM in the Seminar Hall, Department of Chemistry. The topic of the special lecture is **"The field that came in from the cold. The resolution revolution in single particle cryo electron microscopy that led to the Nobel Prize in Chemistry 2017"**. In his talk, he compiled the past, present and future of cryo electron microscopy in structural biology. He highlighted the advantages of cryo electron microscopy over conventional electron microscopy. He took us through a fascinating journey in time from 1970's when electron microscopy was thought to reveal only the images of dead biological specimens to the present day time where we can determine high resolution 3D structure of biomolecules in solution. He concluded his talk with the current status and future prospects of this field within India.

One Day Seminar on Nobel Prize Topics – Gravitational Waves
BUDS THINK – 2018

Date : **25.04.2018**
Venue : **Seminar Hall – II**

The Seminar began as Prof. K. Jeganathan, Head, Department of Physics welcomed the gathering. The gathering had a total count of around 90 excluding the faculty members. The count included about 35 Research Scholars, around 5 M. Phil., Scholars, 50 M.Sc., Students and two Guest Lecturers from Medical Physics. The chief guest Dr. Vikram Vyas from Raman Research Institute, Bengaluru was introduced to the gatherings by Dr. M. Senthilvelan, Associate Professor, Centre for Nonlinear Dynamics. After a brief introduction, the chief guest began his lecture.

The Lecture delivered by the chief guest was in two parts. The first part consisted of the topics and areas that are foundations to learn gravitational waves. The second part was mainly concentrated on the mathematics behind the gravitational wave and the technical aspects of the gravitational wave detection.

The first part of the lecture started with a short recollection about the basic notion of waves, especially electromagnetic waves. The speaker recalled the importance of distance in the propagation of waves in Fermat's principle. As the distance turned out to be relative rather than being absolute, principles of relativity as given by Galileo and Newton were not correct. The speaker mainly differentiated between the three aspects of relativity (given by Galileo, Newton and Einstein) and emphasized the reason why general theory of relativity turned out to be the most general theory which explained gravity. The speaker concluded his first lecture by discussing about the curvature of space-time and introduced the terminology of gravitational waves. Further, the students volunteered themselves with few questions to the speaker and thereby the session got ended.

The gatherings were dispersed for a short tea break.

After tea break, the second session started. In the second part of his lecture, initially the speaker spoke in-depth about how indirect detection of gravitational waves was done, about the reason behind the failure in many attempts for direct detection and how finally direct detection became successful. Then the speaker communicated the technicalities and instrumentation of the LIGO that were used to detect the gravitational waves. In addition to

this, he emphasized the importance of squeezed coherent LASER light which was used in the LIGO. He also discussed about the contribution of Indian Physicists to the theory of squeezed coherent state and many more fundamental theories related with General Relativity, Astrophysics and Cosmology. Not just stopping with these technical details, he elaborated about the quantum mechanical theory and calculations that were used in detection of gravitational wave. With this he finally concluded his lecture on gravitational waves. Further, the session was open to discussion and students asked few curious questions. With a huge applause, the faculties and the students thanked the guest for giving an inspirational lecture to the students. The gatherings then dispersed for lunch.

In the afternoon session, Dr. M. Senthilvelan, President of Physics Forum welcomed the gathering followed by which both research scholars and students presented their talks. The following were the topics in which students made their presentations.

- i. Holographic data storage: A futuristic laser assisted solution for deep archiving.
- ii. Graphene – A dynamics platform for modern life.
- iii. Invention of efficient GaN based LED and future prospects.
- iv. Fibre optics and CCD.
- v. Expanding Universe.
- vi. The rise of Graphene.
- vii. Neutrino Oscillations.

At the end of day, One day seminar on Noble Prize Topics – Gravitational waves successfully came to an end with a vote of thanks offered by P. A. Praveen, Joint Secretary of Physics Forum.


A 5-day (30.10.2017-03.11.2017) Training Programme on
