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
REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES OF "INAUGURATION OF DIGITAL LEARNING"

The Centre for Differently Abled Persons organized the Inauguration of Digital Learning on 4th August 2022, focusing on teaching Computer Language and English through the WinVinaya platform. The program was designed for the faculty and students of CDAP to promote accessible and self-paced digital learning.

Dr. M. Prabavathy, Director, welcomed the gathering and emphasized the importance of digital learning platforms as a flexible and inclusive means of education that enables students to learn at their own pace. She also highlighted how such platforms can bridge gaps in traditional classroom settings, especially for students with disabilities.

The program will run for duration of one year.

resource persons from WinVinaya Foundation gave a comprehensive introduction to the platform. They demonstrated how to access and navigate the learning modules and highlighted features tailored to meet the diverse needs of learners.

Approximately 20 participants attended the session and gained valuable insights into digital self-learning methods. The platform features both guided and self-learning modules, with periodic assessments and remediation plans to monitor and support student progress.

For the benefit of students with hearing impairments, the learning modules include sign language-integrated videos, ensuring accessibility and equal participation.


This initiative marks a significant step toward promoting inclusive digital education and empowering students with disabilities through technology-enabled learning.

The Centre for Differently Abled Persons organized a Two-Day Hands-on Training Program on "Open-Source Screen Reading Software" for persons with vision impairment on 12th and 13th August 2022, at the CDAP Computer Lab.

Dr. M. Prabavathy, Director, delivered the inaugural address and highlighted the growing importance of digital literacy for persons with vision impairment. She spoke about the expanding career opportunities in the IT sector and how assistive technologies are breaking barriers in digital inclusion.



The training program saw the participation of around 20 members, including persons with vision impairment and trainers.

Mr. Shankar Subbiah, Assistive **Technology** Consultant, and Mr. Navarasan, NVDA Trainer Agete Infotech. from Chennai, served as the resource persons for the They program. provided comprehensive hands-on training on the use of NVDA (NonVisual Desktop

Access)—an open-source screen reading software widely used by visually impaired users.



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The training was delivered through a step-by-step demonstration of NVDA functionalities, including keyboard shortcuts, navigation commands, and accessibility features. Participants were given practical exposure to using NVDA effectively for



educational, personal, and professional purposes.

The program was well-received and helped empower visually impaired learners by improving their digital skills and confidence in using assistive technology.



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


Theme: Tribute to Freedom Fighters – Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsay

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"ONE-MONTH SHORT-TERM TRAINING PROGRAM ON DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY"

In an effort to empower persons with disabilities through creative and vocational skill development, the Centre for Differently Abled Persons (CDAP), Bharathidasan University, in collaboration with the National Film Development Corporation (NFDC), Chennai, launched a One-Month Short-Term Training Program on Digital Photography. The program was designed to introduce and train differently abled students—particularly those with intellectual and developmental disabilities—in the art and technology of photography, enhancing both their expressive abilities and future employment prospects.



Inaugural Session

The training program commenced on 21st August 2022 at Dolphin Special School, Tiruchirappalli.The inaugural session was presided over by:

Dr. M. Prabavathy, Director, Centre for Differently Abled Persons and Organizer of the Program and Ms. Praveena Carmel, Director, Dolphin Special School

In her address, Dr. M. Prabavathy emphasized the importance of inclusive skill development programs in creative sectors like photography. She highlighted that with the right training and opportunities, individuals with disabilities can successfully express themselves and find fulfilling livelihoods in media and visual communication.



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Program Objectives

• To introduce students with disabilities to digital photography as a creative skill.



- To provide hands-on training in using cameras and digital devices.
- To develop basic knowledge in composition, lighting, subject framing, and visual storytelling.
- To promote self-confidence, fine motor coordination, and visual literacy among participants.
- To create pathways for potential self-employment or freelance careers in photography.

Participants

A total of 28 students took part in the training program, including:

- 8 students with Intellectual Disabilities
- Other participants with diverse disabilities, including hearing and learning impairments

Each participant was given individual attention and adapted instruction according to their learning abilities and needs.

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Both resource persons brought a wealth of experience and empathy, tailoring the training to suit the pace and comprehension of each participant. They used a combination of visual demonstrations, step-by-step practice sessions, and simplified technical explanations.

Training Modules Covered

- 1. Introduction to Digital Photography
- 2. Framing and Composition
- 3. Lighting Techniques
- 4. Basic Camera Functions
- 5. Portrait and Object Photography
- 6. Photo Review and Feedback

Outcomes and Impact

The training encouraged students to express themselves visually.

Several students discovered a passion for photography and showed significant improvement in handling cameras and composing images. It was the first exposure to a professional creative tool for many participants, boosting their confidence and social engagement. The initiative laid the foundation for future certification-level training or mentorship programs in photography or digital media.



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Valediction



The program concluded on 23rd September 2022 with a small photo exhibition of selected works by the trainees. Parents, staff, and invited guests appreciated the creativity and effort shown by the participants.

Certificates of Participation were distributed to all students by Dr. M. Prabavathy and Ms. Praveena Carmel, recognizing their commitment and successful completion of the training. This one-month training program on digital photography served as a transformative learning experience for students with disabilities. It not only imparted a valuable skill but also contributed to their personal development, confidence, and visibility as artists. 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
ONE-MONTH SHORT-TERM TRAINING PROGRAM ON MULTIMEDIA AND ANIMATION

CDAP. Dr. M. Prabavathy appreciated the efforts of the students. Select projects were showcased during the event.



A total of 35 students with disabilities actively participated in the workshop, engaging in discussions and clarifying their queries, making the program both educational and impactful.




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Report of the Activity: Observance of World Alzheimer's Day

The observance served as an informative and thought-provoking session, strengthening the Centre's mission to empower individuals through awareness and education.






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Report of the Activity: Observance of World Peace Day

The event concluded with the **distribution of certificates** to all participants who successfully completed the training program.



elaborated on how such innovations improve the quality of life, independence, and daily functioning of individuals with special needs.







This initiative not only celebrated Children's Day but also reinforced the commitment of the Centre to nurture, support, and empowers students with disabilities.







A total of 110 participants benefited from this health initiative, making it a successful and impactful outreach activity aimed at promoting health and well-being within the academic community.





This celebration served as an **eye-opener for students and research scholars**, helping them gain deeper





This interaction session served as a meaningful bridge between academia and industry, fostering confidence among students and strengthening industry engagement for inclusive





The program was well-received by the participants and served as a reminder of the enduring legacy of one of India's greatest national heroes.





Report of the Activities "DOMAIN ENRICHMENT COURSE ON INCLUSIVE SOCIAL WORK AND DISABILITY REHABILITATION"

Date: 03-02-2023 to 09-02-2023 **Venue:** Centre for Differently Abled Persons, Bharathidasan University

The Centre for Differently Abled Persons, Bharathidasan University, in collaboration with Indira Gandhi College of Arts and Science, organized a Seven Days Domain Course on Inclusive Social Work from 3rd to 9th February 2023. The program was specifically designed for faculty and students of Social Work, with an objective to enhance their understanding of inclusive education and rehabilitation practices for persons with disabilities. A total of 32 students and 10 faculty members participated in the course.

Day 1: Inauguration and Introduction to Inclusive Social Work (03-02-2023)

The program was inaugurated by **Dr. M. Prabavathy**, Director and Organizer, Centre for Differently Abled Persons, and **Dr. Nagalakshmi**, Professor and Head, Department of Rehabilitation Science, Holy Cross College. The inaugural sessions provided an introduction to disability, key disability legislation, and the fundamental role of social workers in rehabilitation and inclusive education.



Day 2: Prevention of Disabilities and Mental Health Awareness (04-02-2023)

- **Morning Session:** Mrs. Praveena Carmel, Founder of Dolphin Special School and Seagull Special School, discussed Prevention of **Disabilities** highlighted and advantages of inclusive education. The session was especially impactful for the recognized students, as they importance of early intervention and preventive care.
- Afternoon Session:

Mr. Karan Louis, Psycho-social Worker, addressed Mental Health and Its Importance, followed by Dr. Adharsh and Dr. Aishwarya, who presented on Mental Health Awareness in Today's Generation and Stress Management. These sessions equipped students with knowledge on maintaining their own mental well-being and supporting individuals experiencing stress and psychological challenges.



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Day 3: Understanding Learning Disabilities and Mental Health (06-02-2023)

Dr. Nirmala, Assistant Professor, Department of Social Work, Bharathidasan University, delivered a lecture on Mental Health and the Role of Social Workers in Rehabilitation.

The session emphasized the importance of maintaining positive mental health and the significant contribution of social workers in the rehabilitation of persons with mental illness.

Day 4: Disability Rights and Assistive Technology (07-02-2023)

Ms. Maya Prakash, Assistive Technology Expert, and Mr. Kalanjiyam, Techno Expert, addressed the participants on the **Rights of Persons with Disabilities** and demonstrated **Assistive Technologies** used by individuals with hearing impairments. The participants gained practical exposure to tools that improve communication and access for persons with disabilities.

Day 5: Diversity, Inclusion, and Indian Sign Language (08-02-2023)

The day focused on **Inclusion and Celebrating Differently Abled Achievers**, presented by **Ms. Monica**, followed by an informative session on **Hearing Impairment and Indian Sign Language (ISL)** by **Dr. Kannan**. Participants were introduced to the basics of ISL and its importance in facilitating inclusive communication.



Day 6: Field Visit and Simulation Training (09-02-2023)

On the final day, a **field visit** was arranged to the Centre for Differently Abled Persons. Participants had hands-on experience interacting with children with disabilities. **Dr. M. Prabavathy** conducted a **simulation training session** on disability management and demonstrated **recent assistive technologies** to support persons with disabilities. The course concluded with a feedback and evaluation session. Certificates were distributed to all participants.

This seven-day domain course provided future social workers with comprehensive exposure to **inclusive education**, **disability awareness**, **rights**, **mental health**, **and assistive technologies**, preparing them to become effective advocates and professionals in the field of disability and rehabilitation.
