**Workshop Highlights:**

- Introduction to everyday vocabulary and sentence structures
- Practice sessions on functional grammar
- Sign-supported teaching and visual-based learning materials
- Interactive activities such as matching words, fill-in-the-blanks, and sentence building
- Focus on email writing, resume preparation, and common phrases used in workplaces

The sessions were handled by experienced faculty trained in inclusive communication techniques. The teaching was done using sign language interpretation, flashcards, PowerPoint presentations, and visual worksheets to ensure clear understanding and participation.

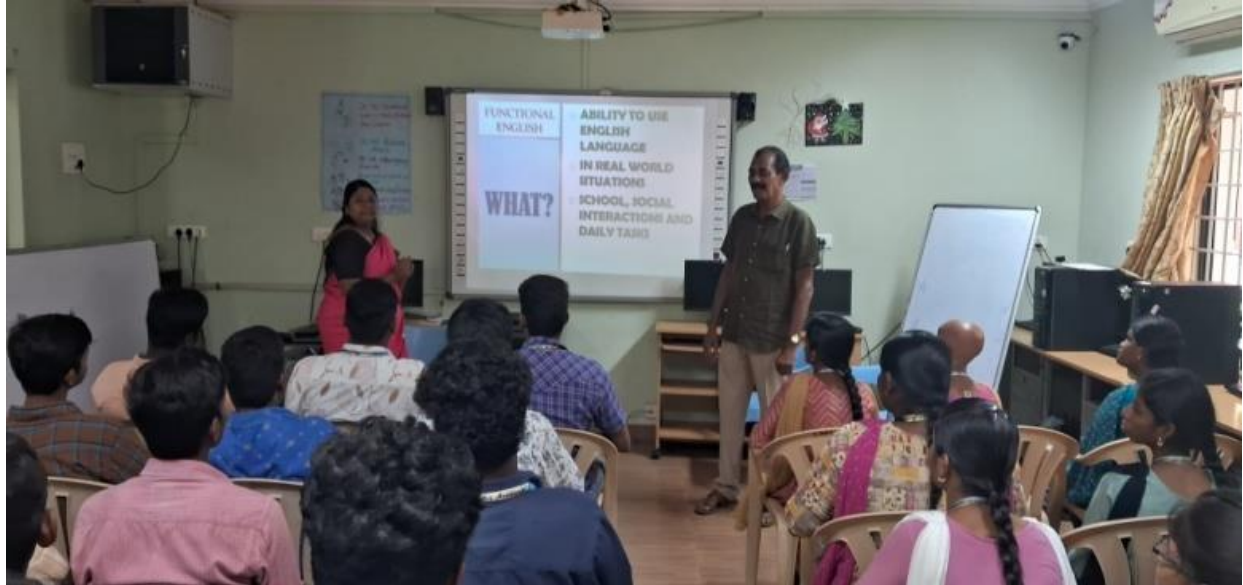

The World Disability Day celebration was a memorable and inspiring event for both students and staff. It reflected the Centre's commitment to holistic development and empowerment of persons with disabilities.



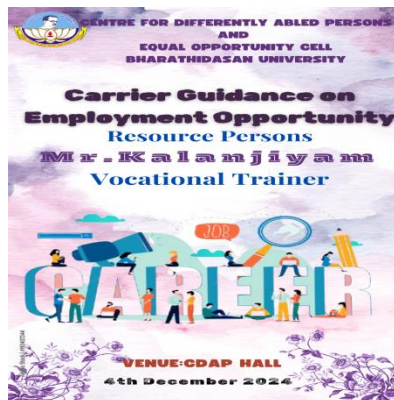

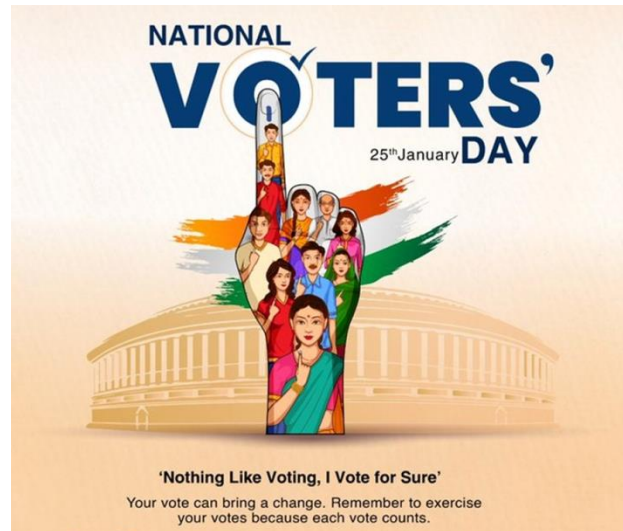

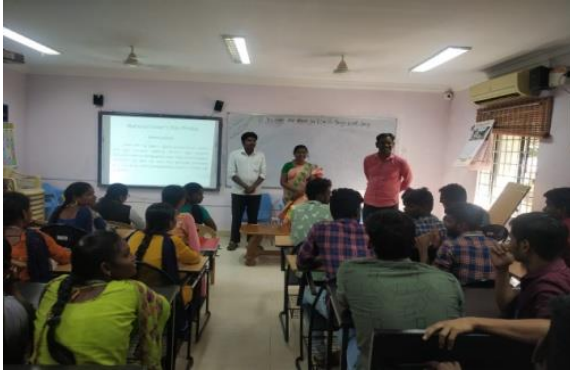

C.Praveena Carmel, Director, The Dolphin Special school has given a presentation on the topic Vocational Education for PWD's through NIOS.

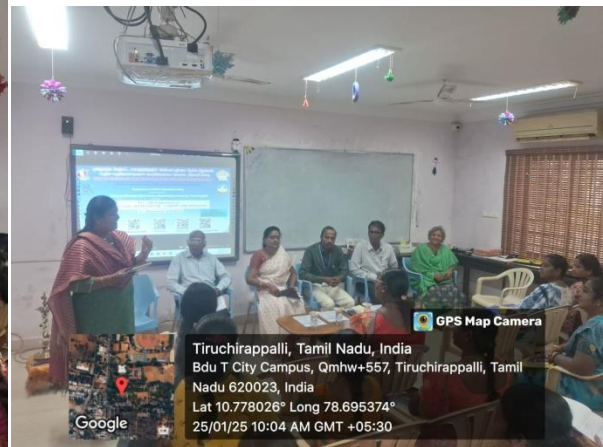

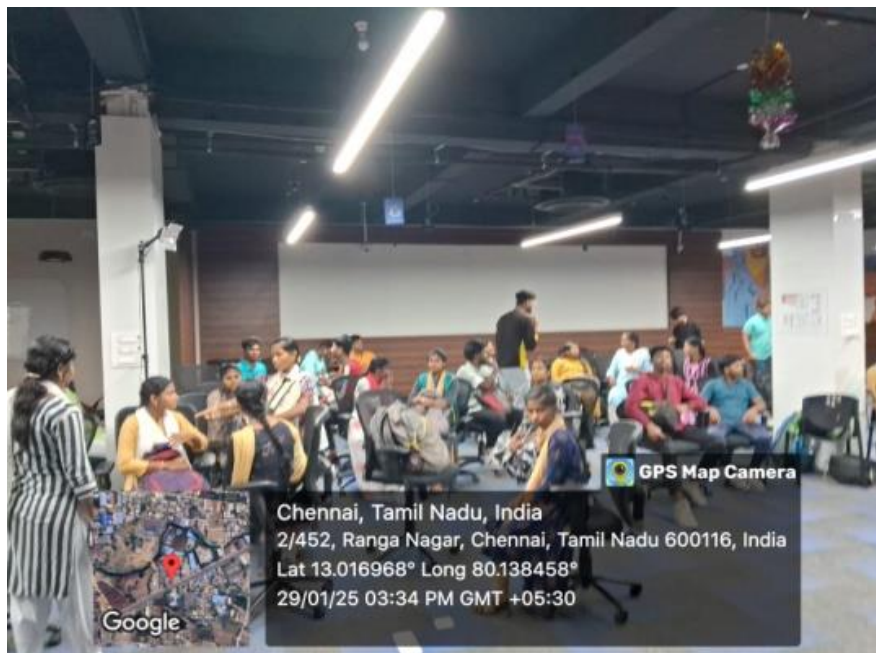
1. **Software Development & Testing:** Students gained insights into the software lifecycle, testing techniques, and debugging processes.

strengthening the spirit of inclusion and understanding .



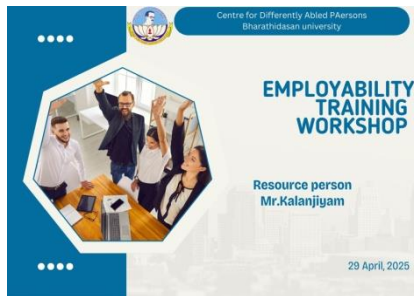
